New Year's Greetings to You!

I hope that you are enjoying this Christmas season, even in the midst of the challenges life brings. After all, that is why Jesus came – to be with us, Emmanuel. I also hope it has been a time of reflection and renewal in the faith. On the heels of Christmas, with its timeless reminder of God's love for us, comes the arrival of a New Year, with its opportunity for new beginnings and its promise of hope! As we all review the year that has passed, we should try to make our plans and resolutions for personal growth for the year ahead.

For our Vincent United Methodist Church, 2023 was a challenging but successful year! By the leadership of the Trustees and Finance Teams, we replaced our aging church roof and gutters and raised the \$150,000 in donations and pledges to cover the project! In the face of the waning coronavirus and by the Holy Spirit, we were able to worship together in person and online. We are averaging about 60 people in church and 30 people on Facebook and phone. By phone, we have several of elderly members worshipping with us. Online we have folks who are ill or unable to make it and regular worshippers from Ohio, Wisconsin and Arizona! With these transitions and through the efforts of many, we have been able to remain connected in Christ as a congregation of faithful disciples.

We made good progress on several of our Church Goals. We completed a GNJ assessment program called "Pathways for fruitful and healthy ministry," developing a strategy for emerging from the pandemic. This includes developing an invitational culture, learning to tell our story, re-growing our youth and family ministries, inspiring generosity, and engaging in implicit bias training.

Our groups and committees all continued to meet this year by video conference. Our accolades to the Outreach Team for leading us in continuing our Care Pantry and Care Kitchen ministries, CROP Hunger Walk, White Gifts, Mitten Tree, and our Tanzania

mission efforts. Our thanks go to the Sunday School and Youth teams for keeping our children and families connected and encouraged and learning and leading the efforts of the RISE Mission Team. Our appreciation to the Music Team for leading transition in our music program staff and their weekly inspiration in worship in a variety of forms. Our gratitude to all those teams and committees that have helped us learn and grow and serve. Our gratefulness to our Technology Team for keeping us connected for worship and to our Marketing Team for reaching out to the larger community through amping up our Facebook page and advertising through our GNJ Grant – we've increased our followers on Facebook since COVID started from 230 to 606! And kudos to all those who gave so much time and contributions and love toward the Lord's work here through Vincent Church. Well done!

The coming year will be one of transition. As you know, I will be retiring as of June 30. The Staff-Parish Relations Committee is working with our District Superintendent and Bishop on determining the next pastor for Vincent Church. Let us keep this process in our prayers.

As we begin this new year, may God bless and guide us as we seek to grow in our depth of spirit, our scope of ministry, and our outreach in mission for our Lord Jesus Christ!

Epiphany Sunday – January 7

We will celebrate **Epiphany Sunday** on January 7, as we mark the arrival of the Wise Men in Bethlehem. It is also the first Sunday of the New Year, so we will share

in a time of reflection and renewal through our worship and the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

What Is Epiphany?

Are you acquainted with the word *epiphany*? It is derived from the Greek word *epiphaneia* and means “an appearance.” Centuries ago the Church set aside January 6, the twelfth day after Christmas (hence the 12 days of Christmas!), and called that day Epiphany, to refer to the revealing of Jesus to the Wise Men who were Gentiles. The very first followers of Jesus were Jewish. The story of the revelation of Christ to the Wise Men, who were non-Jewish, is a reminder that God meant for Christ to be the Savior of the whole world. Have a Merry Epiphany!
