

Dear Friends in Christ,

I was just reflecting on some of the things that have already happened around Vincent Church this year. By and large in the Voice and Update, we tell you what's coming up but not as much about how those things went. Here's a snap shot of what God has been doing around here among us. OK?

First and foremost, we learned that Pastor Sam Park will be the next pastor of Vincent Church following my retirement on June 30. He is a gifted pastor dedicated to helping this church grow in the name of Jesus Christ. Let us keep him and his family and our congregation in prayer in the time of pastoral transition.

In January, we dedicated over 20 of our church leaders to their ministry here, we reported that we fulfilled our 2023 financial obligations including our annual GNJ Conference and mission commitments, our Sunday School averages 10-15 children per week, we continued to lead a community effort to feed over 40 people in need most Saturdays through the Care Kitchen, the Monday Morning Group studied "Holy Envy," the youth had a Movie Night, and we cared for three homeless families through Family Promise.

In February, the youth made over 40 delicious sub sandwiches and the children collected over \$250 for the Souper Bowl of Caring, the Children's Choir restarted, the EYF rebooted with some fun and games, we shared a meaningful Ash Wednesday Service that was attended by over 40 people, twelve youth helped our Care Kitchen team, we dedicated ourselves to spiritual disciplines as we began the season of Lent, we started a Lent series on "The Parables of Jesus," and we hosted our missionaries from Tanzania for three days.

Whew! And that's the "slow" months of January and February!

Beyond this, there are many ongoing efforts that form the bedrock of our church. We also undergird each other with prayer and love in times of need.

#### "The Parables of Jesus" Lenten Series

Our Lenten worship and sermon series this year is entitled "The Parables of Jesus." Jesus was one of the greatest teachers of all time. One of the reasons for that was that he spoke in a way that the people could understand. He did this by telling parables...stories with a point. In an effort to discover Jesus' message to us, we will embark on an exploration of several of Jesus' parables. Some will be familiar. Others will not. All will speak as vibrantly to us as to those to whom Jesus spoke. Join us as we seek grow in our faith and learn some lessons for living.

#### <u>Scout Sunday – March 10</u>

We will celebrate Scout Sunday at our service on March 10. We invite all of our Girl Scouts and Scouts BSA and their leaders to wear their uniforms to church that Sunday. The service will include a special time of recognition and blessing for all our Scouts, their leaders, and their families.

#### UMCOR Sunday - March 17

We will be collecting the "UMCOR" offering on March 17. This offering is collected each year to aid the work of the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), which responds immediately on our behalf to the victims of disasters and war around the world. Please try to give generously to this special mission ministry.

#### Palm Sunday - March 24

Palm Sunday is on March 24. It is the day that we mark Jesus' entry into Jerusalem amidst waving palm branches and shouts of "Hosanna!" It also is the beginning of Holy Week, as Jesus prepares to die on our behalf on Calvary. Let us gather to receive our palm branches and prepare to receive as well Jesus' great gift of love and life for us.

#### Holy Week Services

We will have special services on **Maundy Thursday** (March 28) and **Good Friday** (March 29) beginning at

7:30 p.m. The services will be held in the church sanctuary, will be broadcast live from the sanctuary on the church Facebook page, and will be available for Call In using the same Sunday morning procedure. The Maundy Thursday Service will help us remember the events of Jesus' Last Supper and to recall his praving and arrest in the Garden of Gethsemane. There will be hymns, a choir anthem, the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, Rev. LeDuc will share a homily and a dramatic reading. The Good Friday Service will be a Service of Tenebrae, or "shadows." As we read through the events of the day that Jesus died from the Gospel of Mark, we will extinguish successive candles and remember Jesus' suffering and sacrifice for us. This will be interspersed with hymns, prayers, choir anthem, and a homily by Rev. LeDuc. Join us personally or virtually and feel Jesus' love as we walk with him through these painful, yet profoundly powerful, days.

#### Easter Sunday – March 31

We will have one services on Easter Sunday morning, March 31. The Service will be at 10:00 and will feature hymns, a children's sermon, our Wesley Ringers, our Chancel Choir, Rev. LeDuc's Easter Sermon entitled "The Parables of Jesus: Returning!" and the "Hallelujah Chorus" by our Chancel Choir and Friends. The service will be held in the church sanctuary, will be broadcast live from the sanctuary on the church Facebook page, and will be available for Call In. May God bless our worship together as we gather personally and virtually to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ!

#### Vincent Church Is Open for Worship

Vincent Church is open for worship on Sundays at 10:00 a.m. The service is also broadcast live each week on the Vincent United Methodist Church Facebook page and is available by Call In. Vincent United Methodist Church's Church School has classes for children from Kindergarten through grade 12. #### **Spiritual Disciplines for Lent**

Lent is a season of reflection upon our lives, of repentance of our sins, of re-direction of our paths, and renewal of our faith. Life is <u>not</u> easy and we tend to stray from the way. Lent is a time to try to get back on track by seeking God's guidance and help and strength. So, we are encouraged to consider doing one or more of the following for Lent:

- 1. <u>Come to Worship</u> Worship is a weekly discipline that puts us firmly in the presence of God. Through hymns and prayers and scriptures and sermons, God speaks to our hearts and encourages us and seeks to guide us.
- 2. **Pray Daily** Let's take some time to open our hearts to God, sharing our thoughts and concerns and listening for God's guiding in quietness. Even if it is only a few moments, let's take some time to check in with God!
- <u>Read the Bible</u> We'll have available for you a devotional guide called "Sanctuary for Lent." For each day of the season, it has a scripture, a story, and a prayer. Using this or some other devotional, let's take a few minutes each day to be fed by God's word!
- 4. <u>**Give Something Up**</u> Here's the old standby! Let's think of something that we could "give up for Lent" that would be beneficial <u>to</u> us and a ready reminder of Jesus' self-denial for us.
- 5. <u>Do Something</u> Here's a new twist on the old standby. Is there something we could do to reach out in a loving way to someone else in Jesus' name? Perhaps we could try to call or visit or send a card to one person per week that is in need of encouragement, or some other type of witness or service to others.

Which one might be most meaningful for your journey of faith? Which one might help you grow more in the Spirit? Which one or more of these would best fit your schedule? Think about it. Pray about it. Then, decide how this season of Lent can be an especially holy time for you.

The season of Lent is a terrific time to invite someone to come to church with you. In the midst of this season of reflection and renewal, people are more mindful of the place of spirituality in their lives. They are, then, more receptive to an invitation. Do you have a friend, relative, acquaintance, or neighbor who might be struggling with concerns or loneliness, or searching for a church or direction in life? Why not invite them to come to church with you to find the comfort, peace, and love of God we share here? Invite them to come and worship with us, to help at the Care Kitchen or other mission activity, or attend a family night or study group. Our call is to share the good news of Jesus and his love and how it is making a difference in the world through Vincent Church. So let's invite others to come along!

#### **Church Policies Available**

Vincent Church is committed to providing a safe and protected environment for our children, youth and adults. We have a "Safe Sanctuaries Policy" to help reduce the risk of abuse through background checks, youth protection training, and other procedures and protocols. We also have a "Sexual Harassment Policy" to help reduce the risk of harassment in our church. A copy of these policies are available through the Church Office.

#### Vincent UMC Safety Protocol

Our church has developed some safety protocols in case of a fire, medical or security emergency. Our ushers and Church School staff have been trained as to how to proceed with different situations. If you see a situation that needs attention, please speak to one of the ushers for assistance. This might include smoke or fire, someone in medical distress, or someone whose behavior is erratic or makes one uncomfortable. If you see something, please say something to an usher who will then address the situation. We want our church to be a welcoming, safe, and peaceful setting for our worship and service of God.

#### AED Available for Emergency Use

Our church has an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) which can diagnose and defibrillate someone having a heart attack. On opening it, the AED has simple audio and visual commands that are designed to be used by any layperson. It is located in a marked metal box in the hallway to the chapel. While we pray it will never be used, it is available if a heart emergency arises.

#### **Emergency Kit in Usher's Closet**

Our church has an Emergency Kit located on the door in the Usher's Closet opposite the Ladies Room. The kit includes a First Aid Kit, a "Stop the Bleed" Trauma Kit, and Narcan nasal spray opioid overdose treatment. While we pray they never need to be used, they are available in case of a medical emergency.

#### **Monthly Mission Contributions for March**

Our Monthly Mission Offering for March will be used to help those in need through CUMAC. The mission of CUMAC is "to feed people and change lives; to alleviate hunger and its root causes for those in need in Paterson, Passaic County, and northern New Jersey." CUMAC began with one man in a local church in the late 1970s. Growing from the back of Hugh Dunlop's car to a 28,000 square foot building in Paterson, CUMAC provides food for over 4,000 low income people each month, serves as a food depot for smaller area food pantries, operates a thrift store, and provides job training. ## Vincent Voice Sponsors Sought


