"The Parables of Jesus" Lenten-Easter Series

Our Lenten-Easter worship and sermon series this year is entitled "The Parables of Jesus." Jesus was one of the greatest teachers of all time. One of the reasons for that was that he spoke in a way that the people could understand. He did this by telling parables...stories with a point. In an effort to discover Jesus' message to us, we will embark on an exploration of several of Jesus' parables. Some will be familiar. Others will not. All will speak as vibrantly to us as to those to whom Jesus spoke. Join us as we seek grow in our faith and learn some lessons for living.

To Enhance "At Home" Worship

Here are some tips for enhancing your "at home" worship experience. 1.) As the service begins, light a candle inviting God's presence into your worship space. 2.) Have a Bible ready to explore the scriptures with Rev. Dave. 3.) Open up the weekly update, if you are able, scroll down to the very bottom, and have the words to the hymn (s) ready to sing along with the song leader. Church School

Vincent United Methodist Church's Church School has classes for children from Kindergarten through grade 12. Children go to their classes after the children's sermon at church each Sunday, except the first Sunday of each month. The curriculum being used is "Deep Blue" featuring Bible stories, a weekly DVD clip, games, crafts, and activities to help children "grow deeper in their faith." On Communion Sundays (first Sunday of each month), the children remain in church for worship as a family and can pick up a clipboard in the back of the church to do some Bible activities. Rev. LeDuc's Retirement

Rev. David LeDuc will be retiring as of June 30 after 39 years of full-time pastoral ministry for Christ through the United Methodist Church. On June 2 at 2:00, Vincent Church will host a Celebration of Ministry for him. There will be a service in the sanctuary followed by food and fellowship. Then, Sunday, June 9, at 10:00 a.m. will be Rev. LeDuc's last service and sermon. Rev. Dave and his family are scheduled to move out of the parsonage the following week. While he will continue to be available to us through June 30 for pastoral needs, the following three Sunday services will be covered by our church leaders. Let us keep Rev. Dave and his family and our church family in prayer during this time of pastoral transition.

<u>Next Pastor – Rev. Dr. Samuel Park</u>

Bishop John R. Schol has appointed Rev. Dr. Samuel Park as the next pastor of our congregation following Rev. LeDuc's retirement on June 30. Rev. Park will begin his new responsibilities on July 1st of this year. As a United Methodist Church we are a part of an appointment system. Our Staff Parish Relations Committee met with the district superintendent to identify our congregation's needs and the needed skills in a pastor. Pastor Sam was born and raised in NYC. He felt God tug at his heart to be in pastoral ministry at a mission trip in Mexico. He received an M.Div from Drew and D.Min from Wesley while serving churches in NY, MD, NJ, most recently at Delran UMC. He has a heart for preaching, teaching, the local church, missions, and loves to see disciples of Jesus making disciples of Jesus. He and his wife Grace are blessed with two wonderful children. Our new pastor will work with us and the conference so that we continue to make disciples of Jesus Christ. Bishop Schol and the leaders of the Greater New Jersey Conference will work with us to continue to grow as a vital congregation.

Vincent UMC Safety Protocol

Our church has developed some safety protocols in case of a fire, medical or security emergency. Our ushers and Church School staff have been trained as to how to proceed with different situations. If you see a situation that needs attention, please speak to one of the ushers for assistance. This might include smoke or fire, someone in medical distress, or someone whose behavior is erratic or makes one uncomfortable. If you see something, please say something to an usher who will then address the situation. We want our church to be a welcoming, safe, and peaceful setting for our worship and service of God.

Emergency Kit in Usher's Closet

Our church has an Emergency Kit located on the door in the Usher's Closet opposite the Ladies Room. The kit includes a First Aid Kit, a "Stop the Bleed" Trauma Kit, and Narcan nasal spray opioid overdose treatment. While we pray they never need to be used, they are available in case of a medical emergency.

AED Available for Emergency Use

Our church has an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) which can diagnose and defibrillate someone having a heart attack. On opening it, the AED has simple audio and visual commands that are designed to be used by any lavperson. It is located in a marked metal box in the hallway to the chapel. While we pray it will never be used, it is available if a heart emergency arises.

Church Policies Available

Vincent Church is committed to providing a safe and protected environment for our children, youth and adults. We have a "Safe Sanctuaries Policy" to help reduce the risk of abuse through background checks, youth protection training, and other procedures and protocols. We also have a "Sexual Harassment Policy" to help reduce the risk of harassment in our church. A copy of these policies are available through the Church Office.
