Vincent United Methodist Church's Church School has classes for children from Kindergarten through grade 12. The curriculum being used is "Deep Blue" featuring Bible stories, a weekly DVD clip, games, crafts, and activities to help children "grow deeper in their faith." On Communion Sundays (first Sunday of each month), the children remain in church for worship as a family and can pick up a clipboard in the back of the church to do some Bible activities. Veteran's Day – November 11

Veteran's Day is observed on November 11 each year to honor all of those, living and dead, who have served with the US armed forces in times of war and of peace. The holiday was originally called Armistice Day and it commemorated the end of World War I on November 11, 1918. Fighting stopped at 11 a.m., the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. Vincent Church will honor our veterans with special time of recognition, read the names of those currently on our Military Prayer List, and a prayer at our worship service on November 12. The annual Nutley Veteran's Ceremony will be held on November 11 at the World War II Memorial across the street from the church at 11:00. As always, the ceremony begins when we ring our church bell at the 11:00 hour. Let us give thanks for our veterans and pray God's blessing and guidance upon them.

Thanksgiving Food Drive – November 19

Once again we will be having a Thanksgiving Food Drive! On Thanksgiving Sunday, November 19, members of the congregation are asked to bring bags filled with food to help those who are hungry. Most helpful items needed: pasta, tomato sauce (plastic jars preferred), rice, beans, peanut butter, jelly, canned tuna, cereal, vegetables, canned meats. For those worshipping from home, they are invited to drop them by the church between 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. from Monday to Friday during the preceding week. We invite you to consider making this a family project with everyone participating. The food donations will go to CUMAC/ECHO, our United Methodist Food Pantry in Paterson. CUMAC's mission is to fight hunger and its root causes through a holistic, trauma-informed approach that provides groceries and basic necessities to families and individuals in need. Please give generously as these and all food pantries are struggling to meet the growing needs of the hungry in our area.

Nutley Thanksgiving Service – November 20

The Nutley Community Interfaith Thanksgiving Service will be held on Monday evening, November 20, at 7:30 at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church located at 158 Vreeland Avenue in Nutley. Pastor's Report

"Let you light shine before others, so that they may see your good <u>works</u> and give glory to your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:16

V incent Church is a vibrant and vital church engaged in essential and exceptional mission and ministry in the community and the world in the name of Jesus Christ!

We have a story to tell. But we seem to hide it under a bushel. Jesus calls us to "let your light shine!"

Through the guidance of our GNJ conference, we recently completed the "Pathways for fruitful and healthy ministry" process. Through assessment, we were reminded of the many good ways we live and serve as a congregation. Through demographic study, we found that we offer what many people in our community seek for life and faith. Through prayer, we discerned that the missing link is "telling our story" and inviting others to join us.

As we embark on a new church year, may we learn anew how to "let our light shine" and "tell the story" of Jesus, his love, and V incent Church!

Worship and Sacrament

V incent Church offers inspiring worship services where the music is uplifting, all are welcomed, the sacraments are shared monthly, and the sermon is Biblical, accessible and encouraging for the journey of faith in the Lord. We accentuate special church seasons and work to use thematic series, including this year a Lenten series using the music of "Jesus Christ Superstar." We have hybrid worship through inperson, phone in, and Facebook vehicles. Our attendance has remained steady through these vehicles at 95-100. We continue to reach out to those we have missed and those who visit with us.

Evangelism/Making New Disciples

We warmly welcome and follow up with visitors at church. On Facebook, we have a greeter who <u>welcome</u> all participants and follow up with guests. We have community activities to connect especially with families in the community, like the Trunk or Treat and the Living Nativity. We host a Care Pantry and a Care Kitchen to help and connect with those who are poor. We invite the use of our building for community events and services, like the Nutley Winter Market and the Nutley Thanksgiving Service. We connect with our nursery school families in multiple ways. Through Facebook, we have advertised and connected with more people both in our area and out of the area. We received nine new members this past year from other churches.

Discipleship and Faith Formation

Our Church School has been slow to rebound from the pandemic. We continued to have a two-room Sunday School <u>through</u> the year. This fall, we are working to grow <u>in</u> a three-room school. We are excited that our youth program is moving into a dynamic phase, including an annual mission trip to RISE. We have very active UMW circles, a prayer shawl group, weekly studygroups, and choir fellowship groups.

Congregational Care

The congregation is deeply caring to those going through difficulties and has an active prayer ministry. This was especially meaningful in the surrounding in prayer eight of our members and our beloved former Office Administrator, who went home to the Lord. The membership team monitors attendance and reaches out to folks who have been missing and offers support. The Sunshine Ministry Team keeps in touch with our seniors and visits with altar flowers and greetings. Rev. LeDuc visits those in the hospital and keeps in touch with those facing illness and our homebound.

Mission and Community Outreach

We have a Care Pantry for a growing number of people in need and have resumed the Care Kitchen feeding program on a takeout basis for three Saturdays a month in connection with area churches. We

support and partner with Nutley Family Service Bureau, CUMAC, CAMP-YDP, CFBNJ, and Family Promise of Essex County. We lead in organizing a CROP Hunger Walk in Nutley raising over \$3000 each year. We were delighted to send a youth mission team to RISE in NY state this summer. We also continue to offer extensive support to Tanzania UMC mission work. We support our missionaries, a young pastor and helped him build a school, the Hope Center construction, and the women and children's programs.

Generosity and Stewardship

We continue to encourage generosity and faithful stewardship through an annual stewardship program ("Releasing God's Blessings") and reminders through the year in various means. We continue to pay our apportionments in full and support mission work around the world. We collect funds monthly for mission programs. We recently established an Endowment Fund to invite estate and other gifts to help ensure the financial future of our church. Additionally, we raised over \$120,000 in a "Raise the Roof" Capital Campaign to replace our roof and gutters this summer.

Leadership Development

Our church leaders participate in GNJ training as offered, especially the regional foundational training day. We also look for and invite new and younger people to participate in leadership within the church. In doing so, we work to teach them and encourage their leadership development. This helps ensure the next generation of faithful and capable leaders for the church.

Administration

Our church continues to use a committee structure for administering the ministry of the church. The Church Council oversees all the work of the congregation and discusses and sets annual church goals. Trustees, Finance, SPRC, and Nominations handle the administrative items. Membership, Music, Nurture, Outreach, and Worship Committees help organize and advance the ministries of the church. Rev. LeDuc participates in most of these committees and helps keep things coordinated.

Journey of Hope

V incent Church continues to work at ending the sin of racism. This issue continues to be lifted weekly in our Sunday prayers and on our prayer list. Rev. LeDuc led two "Conversations on Race" groups. Two study groups were held about the issue. Rev. LeDuc shared a two-part sermon series on "Learning on Racism" that were powerful and deeply affirmed by the congregation.

Other

These last years have been incredibly challenging for life and ministry. We have worked hard and succeeded by the grace of God to weather the storm. Our church and virtual attendance is the same as before the pandemic, our finances have been pretty steady, and our ministries are on the rebound.

A word of thanks to the Finance Team for their diligent work and to the Trustees for tackling some important projects both large and small. And thank you to our Staff-Parish Team as we have transitioned in two of our staff positions. And thank you to everyone who has contributed to the mission and ministry of Christ at and through V incent Church!

I also want to express my thanks to our staff who do so much for us and to Bishop Schol and District Superintendent William M. Williams III for their leadership and support. And <u>finally</u> a big "thank you" to my family. Billy, his wife Chelsea, and their beautiful daughter Maya are all doing well. Scott has been an invaluable help with our technology since COVID hit. And I thank my wife Karen for her steadfast love and support and encouragement in life and in ministry!

May the Lord continue to grace and guide and inspire and challenge us for faithful and vibrant mission and ministry together as we "let our light shine" and "tell the story<u>" of</u> Jesus, his love, and V incent Church!
